Support for Victims of Domestic Abuse and Sexual Exploitation

The Coronavirus pandemic is a worrying time for everyone, but for those living with domestic abuse it can be a terrifying and potentially dangerous time. However, no one should ever have to suffer abuse from anyone or made to feel unsafe where they live.

Victims of domestic abuse in Copeland are being urged not to suffer in silence and should be reassured that the council is on hand to support people who have left, or need to leave, their homes because of it.

Copeland's Housing Options Team is here to support individuals in need of help and emergency accommodation.

The Council has a Prevention and Crisis Support Officer to provide confidential advice and support for those who need it.

If you believe you are in immediate danger at any time please call the police on 999 or 101 for nonemergency assistance. If calling from a mobile, and are unable to speak, press 55 to make yourself heard and this will transfer the call straight to the police.
