The MOJ has allocated £25 million from a total of £76 million worth of funding by way of a COVID-19 Emergency Funding. A percentage of this funding, £170,000 has been allocated to the OPCC for Cumbria and will be distributed upon application to the following:

- DA services already commissioned by the OPCC,
- DA services not commissioned by the OPCC,
- SV services already commissioned by the OPCC.

The funding period is for 24/03/20 - 31/10/2020 and can be applied for to cover the following:

- additional costs,
- Costs incurred in adapting services online in response to government guidelines,
- Costs incurred owing to increased demand,
- Short term income disruption
- Essential costs of sustaining a current service/activities
- Purchase of assets to support a move towards digital / remote working
- The cost of additional staff to cover staff who are not able to work owing to COVID-19

This list is not exhaustive but by way of example.

Should the constabulary or partner agency refer into any organisation not funded by the OPCC and which you feel would benefit from the emergency funding could you please refer them to the OPCC web site where the application Excel spreadsheet and guidance can be found. The closing date for applications to the OPCC is 1<sup>st</sup> June 2020.
