Step Up Remote - Message from the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner - Step Up Remote is now nearing completion, thank you very much to everyone who has referred families or shared this opportunity with your networks. The responses were fast and furious and we reached capacity by the end of week 7. Unfortunately, we cannot take any further referrals at this point as we were only funded for 12 weeks as an emergency response to Covid-19. However, we have received very positive feedback from practitioners and agencies have expressed how they value being able to offer families support from Step Up both as a face to face programme and remotely.


