A Duty to Protect – report findings

The <u>Centre for Women's Justice</u> lodged a super-complaint against the police back in 2019, highlighting 'serious failures' by the service to use powers in order to protect domestic abuse victims. It warned that the police are putting women and girls at risk by not using protective mechanisms, such as pre-charge bail with conditions and restraining orders, when violence is perpetrated. This resulted in the HM Inspectorate of Constabulary, Fire and Rescue Services launching an investigation, <u>the findings</u> of which have now been released.
