- Crisis intervention and access to secure emergency accommodation for
- households in a domestic abuse crisis or identified as being at severe risk of

harm from others.

- Non-judgemental, personalised help and support to address any immediate
- safeguarding and longer-term rehousing needs identified.
- Specialist housing assessment and support including relocating to another
- area for those at serious risk of harm.
- Advocacy support working with key partners and statutory bodies to mitigate
- risks and promote community safety, including advice and assistance to
- anyone identified who poses a significant risk to others.
- Access to personal and community safety interventions.
