## **Modern Slavery in Cumbria**

A recent case in of Modern Slavery at a local car wash in Cumbria has been documented in a documentary. The Moment of Proof available on BBC i Player shares the real life case and story of how local detectives brought two men to justice for running a modern slavery ring at a car wash in Carlisle.

# The Clewer Initiative Safe Car Wash App

The Safe Car Wash App enables anyone who uses hand car washes to identify and report slavery. The app asks a series of questions related to the indicators of modern slavery and then assesses the answers. If there is a high likelihood that modern slavery is occurring at the hand car wash, users are invited to send a report to the Modern Slavery Helpline at the touch of a button. By visiting a hand car wash and submitting a report you can help law enforcement end exploitation at hand car washes. You can download the free app here.

### Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC) – Be Safe, Stay Safe Symposium

In November 2022 the OPCC organised a Be Safe, Stay Safe Symposium. The symposium was well attended and enjoyed by all involved. The OPCC has secured further funding which will allow us to replicate this event across the county.

The symposium will raise awareness of the impact of crime and ASB on the local community and discuss local **current issues affecting young people.** Alongside raising awareness young people will be advised how to report and seek support from relevant agencies.

The November 2022 symposium consisted of presentation which focused on local issues affecting young people. Alongside the presentations we also arranged for other agencies to attend and set up a 'marketplace' within the foyer so students could ask questions and seek support if necessary. The agencies involved included but not limited to Police; Victim Support; Barnardo's; Safety Net and Drug Support.

We have further Symposiums booked and would love for you to join the 'marketplace' and showcase the amazing work you all do.
