'Getting To Work on Modern Slavery in Cumbria' Event

Churches Together in Cumbria (CTiC) have been working in partnership with Women's Community Matters (WCM) on the overlap between domestic/sexual abuse and exploitation and modern slavery and there is much we'd like to do together. We held an event on 12th May at WCM in Barrow. There were about 80 people in attendance from lots of different agencies and groups, including some experts from out-of-region. We talked about the current situation in Cumbria and thought about what could be done to improve awareness, collaborative working and victim support in relation to modern slavery.

One of the outcomes was a desire to stay in touch with each other in order that people can receive information, resources and make connections etc. So, a contacts group has been started and there will be another event in October in Penrith, when we'll think about partnerships and some areas to focus on.
