<u>Update from Cumbria Modern Slavery Champions Network</u>

1.Plans to restart a **modern slavery partnership** are progressing well. We plan to hold our first meeting at the end of January 2024. This will be the place of strategic discussion and planning between many statutory bodies and third sector agencies. 2. Asylum Seeker Hotel Closures in Carlisle

You may already know about this issue, but I wanted to ask that we all be vigilant to the extra vulnerabilities for this group of people in our midst at this time. Struggling to find housing and to meet other needs, these individuals are wide-open to risk of exploitation.
